National **Eucharistic Revival: Parish Phase**



The start of the second phase of the National Eucharistic Revival focuses on the parish level and begins

on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*), Sunday, June 11, 2023. To commemorate this most sacred day and the beginning of the parish phase of the Revival, each parish in the Diocese of Scranton is asked to offer some ritual to emphasize the unique and life-giving place of the Most Holy Eucharist in the life of the Church. A traditional Eucharistic Procession or a period of Eucharistic Adoration would be two such opportunities.

A Eucharistic Procession would go outside into our streets and neighborhoods as a visible act of bringing Jesus to the world. As Pope Francis explained, "The procession with the Blessed Sacrament—a hallmark of the feast of Corpus Christi…reminds us that we are called to go out and bring Jesus to others. To go out with enthusiasm, bringing Christ to those we meet in our daily lives." If necessary, however, the procession can remain on parish grounds.

If unable to organize a Eucharistic Procession, each parish is asked to consider conducting a period of **Eucharistic Exposition and Adoration** that day, possibly including Evening Prayer and concluding with Benediction to give the faithful an opportunity for prayer in the presence of our Eucharistic Lord.

Each parish is also asked to consider celebrating a "Forty Hours Devotion" or at least a Eucharistic Day of Prayer and Adoration at some point during the course of this upcoming year, perhaps on your parish feast day or at another appropriate time. Please share with David Baloga, Director of Worship, the dates and details of your Forty Hours/ Eucharistic Day of Prayer and Adoration (dbaloga@dioceseofscranton.org or 570-207-2213, ext. 1158) so that we may publish them on the diocesan website and in each edition of *The Catholic Light* during upcoming year.



Precious Blood Offered at Mass

The following is from an email from Bishop Bambera on March 24, 2023 to all priests, deacons, and parish life coordinators.

Regarding the sacred liturgy, extraordinary measures were taken during the COVID-19 pandemic to protect the health of the faithful. While most of these restrictions were gradually relaxed, the distribution of the Precious



Blood at Mass continued to be suspended out of an abundance of caution. Now that many of the pandemic-era public health restrictions have been lifted, I am pleased to announce that **beginning on Holy Thursday, April 6, 2023, parishes may resume the practice of distributing the Precious Blood to the faithful at Mass** at the discretion of the pastor, administrator, or parish life coordinator. The faithful have the option to receive Holy Communion under one or both species, with the understanding that those who receive under only one species are not deprived in any way of the fullness of Lord's Presence.

Since the practice of offering the Precious Blood has been suspended for quite some time, pastors, administrators, and parish life coordinators must see to it that trained Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion review the proper procedures for offering the chalice at Mass.


